Details	LEVEL 2 PLAN
Physical Distancing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Staff and students will be expected to maintain 2-meter distancing. Each student will have a contact teacher to assist with communication and check-ins. They will remain in their assigned areas as much as possible. ● Students from the same family do not have to meet physical distancing requirements. ● The classroom teacher will remain as the main point of contact for parents and students
Arrival	<p>To reduce crowding, students will have meeting spots on the playground that will ensure adequate distancing between classrooms. Students will meet their teacher or an EA at the designated meeting spot at 8:40am. Should weather be uncooperative (below -27, storming/raining), students will proceed directly to their classrooms through their designated door.</p> <p>Please do not drop your child or send your child earlier than 8:40am.</p> <p>Meeting spots: (spots are subject to change and this will be communicated to your child through their teacher should this occur) Meeting spots remain the same as the yellow plan.</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">Grade: Kindergarten Door: back west Meeting spot: pavement on west side of building</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">Grade:1 Green Door: back west Meeting spot: pavement on west side of building</p>

Grade:2 McLeod
Door: back west
Meeting spot: basketball court on west side

Grade:2 Barteaux
Door: front west
Meeting spot: basketball court on west side

Grade: 1 Robson
Door: front west
Meeting spot: outdoor classroom area

Grade: 3 Klassen/Treloar
Door: front east
Meeting spot: grassy area front of the school (east)

Grade: 4 Manns
Door: front east
Meeting spot: grassy area front of school (west)

Grade: 3 Gensorek
Door: back east
Meeting spot: basketball court south of school

Grade: 4 Duguay/Hofer
Door: back east
Meeting spot: swing area on east side

If students arrive at school after 9 am, they will need to enter through the front door of the school and buzz to get in. All other entrances will be locked at 9 am as per usual.

If students arrive before 9am but after their classroom has gone in the school, they will enter through their designated doors and proceed directly to their classrooms.

<p>Dismissal</p>	<p>Students attending the YMCA Before and After School Program will be taken to the gym prior to the class going outside. They will meet the coordinator there at that time.</p> <p>To reduce crowding, students will have staggered dismissals at the following times:</p> <p>Dismissal doors will be the same as arrival doors above.</p> <p>Kindergarten 3:15 Bus students will proceed out to bus loop with an EA while town students will remain at the outside meeting spot with the teacher until students are picked up.</p> <p>Grade 1 3:20 Grade 1 classes will proceed to their outside meeting spot. Bus students will proceed to bus loop where Ms. Galatiuk/designate will monitor bus boarding while the teacher waits with town students until buses have cleared the loop. If students are to walk home on their own they will be dismissed once the buses leave the loop. If parents are picking up, they can proceed home with a parent before buses leave.</p> <p>Grade 2 3:25 same procedure as grade 1</p> <p>Grade 3 3:30 same procedure as grades 1 and 2</p> <p>Grade 4 3:35 same procedure as grades 1,2 and 3</p> <p>Please avoid entering the school building for pick up/drop off at this time. Please avoid the use of the staff parking lot for pick up/drop off before and after school.</p> <p>Buses will begin loading at 3:15. Ms. Galatiuk or her designate will be at the bus loop daily to assist with the boarding of buses.</p>
<p>Movement of Students</p>	<p>Masks must be worn by students in grades 4 to 12 and all staff in common areas. Exceptions are in the classroom when 2 meters distancing can be maintained.</p> <p>Teachers will move from classroom to classroom. Students will remain in their designated area in the school.</p> <p>Regular in-class movement breaks, recess, and Phys. Ed classes will continue.</p>

	<p>Indoor or outdoor non-contact sports (e.g., basketball, soccer) may occur with physical distancing during the play, except for brief exchanges of close contact as recommended by Public Health and MB education.</p> <p>Field trips that require transportation will not occur at this time.</p>
<p>Recess/ Breaks</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To reduce crowding, students will go out for recess at staggered exit times and will play with children in their cohort only in their designated space. • Each cohort will have a container of equipment to play with that will be cleaned between uses. • Zones on the playground will be designated with cohort groups cycling through the different areas on a scheduled basis. • Hand hygiene performed before and after recess. • Kindergarten will have a separate recess break from the grades 1-4 students. • At the conclusion of recess, students will assemble at their meeting spot where an adult will meet them and bring them inside. • Indoor recess – students will remain in their classrooms
<p>Lunch</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students will practice hand hygiene before and after eating • Town families who are able to accommodate lunch at home are encouraged to do so to assist in reducing numbers over the lunch hour. If students are going home at lunch, please return by 12:45. • Students must bring their own lunches • No food or water bottle sharing permitted between students • No hot lunch days will be offered at this time. (pizza day, subway day etc.) • Students eating lunch at school will eat in the classroom wiping down their eating area before and after lunch • Lunch times: grades: k-4 will eat lunch from 11:50-12:10 in their own classrooms and proceed outside in a staggered manner to avoid crowding to play in their designated zones with their cohort from 12:10-12:45. At the conclusion of the lunch hour, students will meet an adult at their designated arrival meeting spot and proceed into the school through their designated door.

<p>Classroom Configuration</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Our classroom arrangements support physical distancing for 2 meters. Interaction of smaller groups will be supported and large group activities will be limited • Classroom configurations are adjusted to meet the 2-meter physical distancing and this may require possible changes to the school location, classroom location, classroom teacher, and student configuration of each class. • Outdoor spaces are being used and encouraged when possible • Hand sanitizer or hand washing will be used for entry and exit from the classroom • Wearing masks will be encouraged for k-3 students who can wear them independently and are required for staff and grade 4 students. • Students will sanitize iPads, computer keyboards and mouse after use
<p>Instruction</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Student-contact time is being prioritized • In class interactions ensure physical distancing of 2 meters and group sizes comply with gathering restrictions not to exceed maximum capacity of area while maintaining 2-meter physical distancing. • Adults will be required to wear a mask • We are focusing on teaching outcomes rather than the amount of time per subject (a cross-curricular approach is recommended) • Gym classes will continue with playing and learning outdoors as much as possible. Any equipment that must be shared will be sanitized between classes. • There will be limited use of common areas in the school based on gathering capacities; these areas will be repurposed for classroom space when possible; these spaces will have staggered entrance and exits maintained when needed • Arrangements will be made for library resources to be delivered to the classrooms for borrowing; self-selection in the library will not be occurring at this time • Hand sanitizer will be used before and after touching any devices/shared materials; students will wipe devices or spray materials with sanitizer after use • Based on MB education’s guidelines, we are prioritizing essential outcomes in literacy and numeracy in all areas • Teachers will be preparing blended learning environments for possible class cancellations or upon Public Health Advice. We will be using Class Dojo for communication and blended learning as well any

	<p>remote learning when needed. Please ensure you are signed up for this with the classroom teacher the first week of school.</p>
<p>School Supplies and Personal Belongings</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Student supplies will be labeled with their name and organized into personal containers. • Based on current public health guidelines, we are recommending that you send your child with a non-medical mask. Students in grade 4 will be provided with a mask should they arrive without one. • For any materials that need to be shared, students will hand wash/sanitize before and after use. Materials will also be sanitized after use • Lockers for grades 3 and 4 students will be utilized and accessed in a staggered manner to avoid crowding and to maintain 2m distancing. Only one child will occupy each locker therefore some students will be keeping their belongings in a Rubbermaid tub in the classroom. • It is essential that students only bring materials they will be needing for the school day (lunch kit, agenda, runners, water bottle, mask, outdoor clothing). Please don't bring toys, games, trading cards etc. as they will not be permitted.
<p>Volunteers/Visitors to the School</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We will be minimizing the number of outside visitors to the school at this time. Should you need to visit the school, call 834-2828 and make an appointment. • All visitors must adhere to mask use, self-screening, physical distancing and recommended hygiene practices. Visitors with any symptoms consistent with COVID-19 should not enter the school. Schools are required to keep a list of all visitors. • Community use of schools will be suspended, with the exception of the YMCA before and after school program. • Online or telephone contact is encouraged as much as possible
